Our Asian rep writes

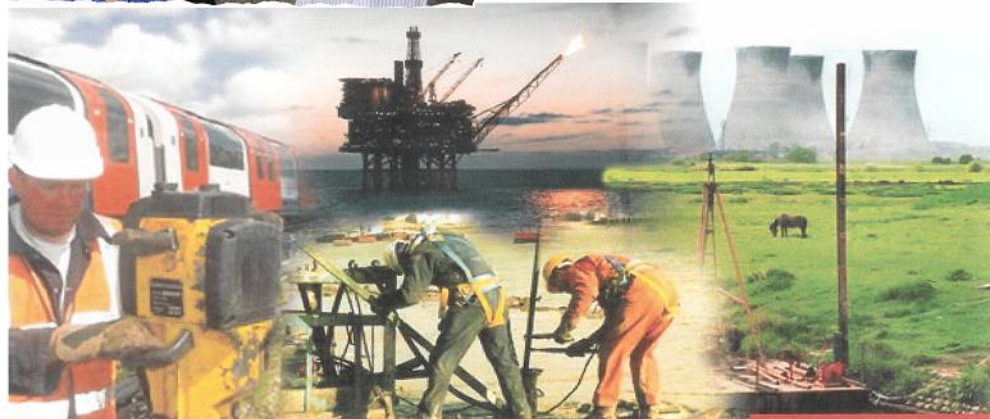
