### **BIGGIN HILL'S MUSICAL TRIBUTE TO "THE FEW"**

Friday 22nd March 2013 saw the concept launch to the media of a unique new event at Biggin Hill Airport.

For those of you that have enjoyed the Aviation Proms at Chartwell and Loseley Park in Guildford in the last three years, there is a real treat for you. Organised by Synergy Events UK (Colin Hitchins) on behalf of the Biggin Hill Heritage Hangar, and in association with Biggin Hill Airport Ltd, 17th August 2013 will see Biggin Hill Airport transformed into a specialist aviation Prom venue.

In addition to the huge stage with its massive sound system, located between Interflight and RAS Completions hangars, and flanked by huge TV screens, that part of the airfield will become a full "Musical Tribute to the Few" for a day. This day will commemorate "The Few" and the role of RAF Biggin Hill during the Battle of Britain on the anniversary of what became known as "The Hardest

Day" when the Luftwaffe attempted to finally destroy the Royal Air Force.

Music will be provided by the Central Band of the Royal Air Force supported by actors and singers, including the famous "West End Kids" and soprano, Fiona Howell. (more than 150 performers in all will appear on stage). The musical event will include video and still archive material, re-enactors and special effects that, together with narration from actor Martin Shaw, will tell the story of "The Few". (Martin Shaw, who many will remember for his roles in the Professionals, and Judge Dread, to name but a few is himself a pilot and keen enthusiast of the period).

On the ground, and in the air, supporting the event are expected to be up to 8 Spitfires, 2 Hurricanes, an ME108, and a Lancaster bomber. These will be provided from the fleet of aircraft owned and operated by the Biggin Hill Heritage Hangar, other private owners, and the RAF Battle of Britain Memorial Flight (who of course were originally formed at Biggin Hill).

The event is held in support of the Royal Air Force Benevolent Fund, and the Chartwell Cancer Trust.

This is not, nor is it intended to be, a new "Air Fair", rather a unique specialist musical extravaganza featuring aircraft that have played such an important part in Biggin Hill's history. As those who attended the previous Proms organised by Synergy will undoubtedly agree, you will not be disappointed - make sure you put the date in your diaries, and do book early - there will be a finite number, so you really won't want to miss out on this first ever open air musical event at Biggin Hill Airport..

In conjunction with Biggin Hill Airport, and Surrey & Kent Flying Club, this bequest is close to being awarded.

A difficult decision, I'm sure, for Gary and his colleagues, but I'm sure we all wish them well in this final stage in their deliberations, and of course, wish the ultimate winner of this scholarship a Biggin Hill welcome into our world of aviation.

### MONTHLY REPORT FROM THE OFFICE OF JENNY MUNRO

Thank you once again for the opportunity to update you all from the Airport's perspective.

As March draws to a close, so does the end of our financial year 2012-2013. Although not disastrous, it certainly did not materialise as the bumper year everyone expected, due to the London 2012 Olympic and Paralympic Games. This is a shame, as I would have relished ploughing record profits into my infrastructure wish list! However, on the upside, Biggin continues to hold its position in the London business and general aviation market extremely well. We have seen a slight rise in market share of business aviation, and this can only be good for everyone,

keeping our future as secure as it can be in this rather challenging economy. We continue to make measured investments in the field, and the new Fire Station is the latest example of that. Thank you to everyone who continues to bring their custom to Biggin Hill Airport. We do appreciate it, and we do realise that you have a choice.

On a local level, and crucial to the continued and increased success for the small and large businesses on the Airport, is the current Consultation phase of the Bromley Draft Local Plan. There is greater support than ever from the Council, and Biggin Hill along with two other areas in Bromley (Town Centre and the Crays) has been identified as an area that, with support, could generate significantly more jobs and economic value locally.

We are obviously really encouraged by this and I would ask as many of you as possible to respond to the Consultation (soon, before you forget and the deadline of mid- passes!), supporting the Preferred Options which relate to us. We especially like Preferred Options 91 and 92 – just in case you don't fancy reading through the entire document and prefer to skip directly to them. These Preferred Options talk about enhancing employment and business opportunities at the Airport, whilst balancing these with environmental quality – something that we entirely support. Human nature means that many people do not respond if they agree with something or support it, and the real effort is made by objectors. You simply need to say whether you agree or disagree with any of the Options in the document, and you will find the ones relevant to us at numbers 91 – 93 (including a positive statement on West Camp).

On a national level, the UK Aviation Policy Framework was published last week, which we found to be in line with our objectives and more encouraging for our sector (business and general aviation) than the 2003 Aviation White Paper which it replaces. Anyone wishing to read it can access it here:
