# **CAPTAIN ERIC (WINKLE) BROWN**

We recently had our attention drawn to a petition to the Government to show recognition of this great man's achievements. Eric Brown is an outstanding individual who fought in WW2 with the Fleet Air Arm. He subsequently assisted with making the UK the foremost developer of fighter aircraft and air power technology.

Captain Eric Melrose "Winkle" Brown, RN, CBE, DSC, AFC, Hon FRAeS (born 21 January 1919) is a former former Royal Navy officer and Test Pilot who, in testing 487 different types of aircraft, is reputed to have flown more types than anyone else in history. He also holds the world record for most aircraft carrier landings performed (2,407) and is the Fleet Air Arm's most decorated living pilot.

## AIRPORT EXTENDED HOURS PROPOSALS SUCCESS

The Council's report of the results of their public consultation was published recently – see http://www.bigginhillreunited.co.uk/consultationresults.pdf

With 31,500 votes (76%) in favour of the proposals, out of a total of 41,711 votes polled, it was an excellent result for our airport.

We all awaited with interest the Council's actual vote as to whether to accept or reject the plans. That vote was conducted, in front of several hundred members of the public, the majority of whom were loyal airport supporters and local Biggin Hill residents, on Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> March. The result was overwhelmingly in favour of the airport, with some 36 Councillors voting in the Council Chamber in favour with only 10 against. The proceedings then moved from the Council Chamber into the Great Hall, where the Council Executive again considered the matter, still voting after their deliberations 4 to 2 in favour, agreeing to move into negotiations to allow an extension of airport hours within the lease (an overall vote of 40 against 12).

Biggin Hill's team must be congratulated on their campaign, and we await with interest the next stage.

The airport's success was in no doubt enhanced by the tremendous support given by the members of Biggin Hill Reunited and the airport Tenants, who also turned out in force on the night to lend support to Andrew, Robert, and Will. I know they would want me to express their appreciation to all who gave up their time to help during the Council meeting.

From my own personal point of view, thank you sincerely for responding to my requests for your support. You turned out in your dozens. Thank you so much...

#### **HEADSETS - PASSIVE OR ACTIVE**

Do you have your own headset? Is it a "Passive" model, like the very much used David Clark H10-13.4, or is it an "Active" or "ANR" model?

If, like me, you have the former, and have grown to like what you have, but would also quite like to have the more modern Active Noise Reduction (ANR) type. But maybe you can't really justify giving up on a perfectly good headset and spending anything up to £800 or more on a new replacement, this idea may work for you.

After much research I have had my standard DC H10-13.4 upgraded with a great ANR conversion kit produced by Headsets Inc, of Texas. Slightly dubious at first, I didn't want to change headsets as I like the ruggedness of mine when compared with the top of the range Bose. I also had heard less favourable reviews on the newer David Clarke headsets ANR performance. It was good to see that Flyer carried out some tests a few years back that really scored this conversion very highly, placing its performance up there with the less rugged and very expensive Bose models.

I must say that the performance is excellent and a relatively inexpensive way to get the advantages that ANR offers. Whilst the kit can be self installed, I didn't feel that confident in my own ability, so I went to Dave Lewis of Flackwell Electronics, near Aylesbury, who specialises in such conversions. He knows exactly what kit is required for each headset type (there are several different versions and accessories) and has converted loads of

different ones to ANR. Personally, I would prefer to get it done by someone who knows, rather than attempt it myself. Dave charges around £225 + VAT for the full conversion including the Kit, replacement cables and the optional Auto Battery Shut Off box (essential if you, like me, are likely to forget to turn the power off).

## **FESTIVAL OF FLIGHT 2015**

75 years ago the RAF airfield at Biggin Hill was in the front line in the defence of Britain, in what was to be called by Winston Churchill "The Battle of Britain". This year's Festival of Flight on 13<sup>th</sup> June commemorates the turning point of WWII on the actual ground from which "The Few" flew their Hurricanes and Spitfires.

The highlight of the extensive flying display will be a tribute to the "Few" by the Royal Air Force which is to be staged at only one or two venues and includes the Red Arrows, BBMF Spitfire/RAF Typhoon syncro display, and multiple BBMF fighters. The Biggin Hill Heritage Hangar will re-enact a Battle of Britain scramble which will include large scale pyrotechnics and a special appearance of a ME109G from the Flugmuseum in Germany and the Duxford based Mkl Bristol Blenheim. Other favourites include the Brietling Wingwalkers, RAF Chinook and Yakovlev's aerobatic team, see the website for an up to date list of participating aircraft.

The show returns to the usual format of gates opening at 9:30 AM with the closing flying display at 5:30 PM. In the morning our arena events will keep you entertained with a line-up that includes the IMPS motorcycle display team, Metropolitan Police Dog display team, Gymnasts and a classic car Rally. On stage we will have the vintage singing group Puttin on the Blitz, The Patriot Girls, West End Kidz and other acts.

Arena - Stage - 1940's Village - Model Zone - Fun Fair - Children's Amusements - Catering Areas - Crafts - Exhibitors - Static Aircraft - Simulators - Military Careers

As in 2014 the tickets will be sold in advance only and limited to 18,000 people. Tickets are on sale from the 1st April see WWW.BHFOF.COM for full details and prices or call the Festival of Flight information line 01959 578571.

### MONTHLY REPORT FROM THE OFFICE OF WILL CURTIS

I am extremely pleased to report that the Council, for the first time in 21 years, have approved an application by Biggin Hill Airport Limited to vary the operating criteria for the airport. We will need to agree with the Council how we are going to deliver the noise control measures required to ensure that we can reduce our agreed noise footprint to 50% of its previously agreed, so do not expect anything to change for a few months at least. I will keep you all posted.

A massive thank you is due to the many Biggin Hill based pilots and staff showed up at the Civic Centre on 25th March for the Full Council meeting held in the Council chamber. Airport supporters filled the public gallery and gave support to those Councillors speaking in favour of our proposals.

The Council voted 36/10 in favour and the matter was then referred to the Executive who met in the Great Hall immediately after the Council meeting. The Executive, which voted 4/2 in favour, was addressed by Council noise consultant Vernon Cole who reassured Councillors and local residents regarding the effectiveness of the noise control measures proposed. It was vital to have our many supporters present as this definitely helped Councillors to arrive at the right decision as they felt empowered by the very visible and audible public support. The usual anti-airport campaigners were out in force complaining that life in their gated communities might be adversely affected by aircraft noise. Bromley Friends of the Earth were present but were slightly put out when I revealed that their "transport correspondent", an aggressive anti-airport campaigner, had in fact made his living (and a considerable amount of money) by publishing in-flight magazines for airlines based at Gatwick! This seemed to confuse them somewhat and I daresay there is now a heated discussion ongoing within Bromley Friends of the Earth!

We are approaching the spring again and the Easter weekend is almost upon us. I am sure that many will be out enjoying a first flight of the season. You will find that we will shortly launch our new booking out system. There will be iPhone and Android Apps available and a web portal. You will need to book out before calling for start. For many years, we have been one of the only UK airfields not to operate a booking out system and this has caused a lot of radio congestion at busy times, so we were keen to find a way to remove the booking out process from the airwaves. The App will also record your fuel endurance, your destination if applicable, the POB and contact details for the pilot in command. This will allow for better overdue action and will also allow us to keep the requisite aerodrome records more easily. Noise will be a big issue this summer and we now have the Safety And Noise Abatement Review Board (SANARB) up and running. The SANARB will review all noise complaints and safety reports and will take action where pilots have failed to observe our agreed noise abatement procedures. If you are going flying please take a little time to review the noise abatement procedures applicable to the runway you are using. We really do have to be better neighbours so, please, ensure that you are familiar with the noise abatement procedures because, just like the national speed limit, ignorance is no excuse! If we can observe these simple measures, we will be able to enjoy a thriving General Aviation sector at Biggin Hill for years to come.

Work will begin this year on improvements to East Camp. We are drawing up plans for the area and we hope to address matters such as car parking and the landside access during the coming 12 months. We are looking at how we might improve the services to the site (gas, electricity & sewage) as well as options for GA in that area. I will share the plans with you when we have them a little more developed.
