NEW CIRCUIT RESTRICTIONS AT BIGGIN

HURRICANE ENCLOSURE AT THE FESTIVAL OF FLIGHT

Following on from the pressure from members and airport users, for a repeat of the availability of a private enclosure on the flight line at the 2017 Festival of Flight, we made arrangements for another one this year. This has been promoted and publicised in two previous Newsletters already.

Firstly, thanks to all who have sent in their ticket applications already. All who have sent them will have received an email acknowledgement from me, and your cheques are being held here pending release of the passes. Once the passes are released, your requested passes will be sent to you, and your cheques presented for payment.

Based on the degree of apathy we often experience, it was felt we couldn't risk taking the enclosure for both days of this year's two-day event. I am very pleased that we didn't, as the same as happened on previous years, the take up for the marquee and enclosure is very slow! Everyone said that they wanted a Marquee again, and that they would support it, but getting people to put their money where their mouth is takes a lot of effort and chasing.

I have no reason to assume that we won't fill it as always, but please don't leave it to the last minute! Firstly, the price of entry increases from the first of July, but, if it appears we will not have the numbers, then we may have to cancel it and return the cheques to those who have already taken the trouble to book places in it, or more likely, release places in the Marquee to non-tenants and non-members.

We have arranged this for you – at your request – so please don't just leave it until the week before – it may not be there at all if that happens.....

Currently available to any present or past airport users, all airport Tenants, and their friends and families, tickets for the "Hurricane" enclosure and marquee will be exclusively available via myself, and can be obtained by sending your completed application form (obtainable online at http://www.bigginhillreunited.co.uk/hurricane.pdf) back to me as soon as possible, together with your payment and a self-addressed and stamped envelope to enable passes to be dispatched once available. MONTHLY REPORT FROM THE OFFICE OF WILL CURTIS

March has been a busy month for business jets with movements above target. Light aviation has been adequate, though the weather has limited it somewhat as might be expected.

The Airport has been busy on may ongoing projects and during March it concluded an agreement with HSBC for funding of £15 million to complete its new garaging hangar to the north of the terminal and subject to renewed planning permission, the hotel project on the land near the roundabout at Churchill Way. The new 'T2' hangar should be ready by late 2017 whilst the new 4 star hotel will be open in early 2019.

The Noise and Track Keeping System has now been demonstrated to Councillors and will be launched to the public next week. New noise abatement procedures for IFR traffic and procedures for VFR traffic will be published in the AIP imminently. We will also have 'hand outs' in the terminal and will supply these s to all flying clubs in due course. Once these are available, please do take time to study them before flying.

There is quite a bit of work to so on and about the airport this summer, so you will likely see various of these works ongoing on as the months progress. Please ensure that you check NOTAMS before flying as there may be temporary changes to airport procedures as a result.

Now that the clocks have changed, we will doubtless want to be flying later in the day. However, please remember that as of this year, circuit training before 0900 or after 1700 on Saturdays, Sundays and on bank Holidays during British Summer Time is prohibited in order to better contain noise nuisance, especially during peak barbequing time!
