#### **CORONA VIRUS PANDEMIC**

Since the last newsletter at the end of February, the apparently Chinese originated Corona Virus (Covid-19) has arrived with a vengeance throughout the world.

Initially the UK Government policy was for everyone to practice minimum 2 metre "social distancing" and staying in our homes except for certain activities, like going to work if this couldn't be carried out from home, or taking daily exercise once a day etc... Unfortunately some rather foolish people seemed to think these "voluntary" rules didn't apply to them so, on 23<sup>rd</sup> on March, the Government were forced to make the restrictions mandatory and enforceable in law.

This change had a major effect on the aviation industry, with most airlines grounding much of their fleets, and many people's jobs being effectively stopped as a result of non-essential travel being restricted and people being confined to their homes.

These new, now mandatory, restrictions caused much of the general aviation industry to totally cease operations. At Biggin Hill the three flying clubs, EFG, Alouette, and MP Flying Club all closed their doors and completely ceased both flight training and all PPL self-fly hire. Maintenance companies, Falcon and Shipping and Airlines, closed their doors except for AOG assistance to avoid staff and clients breaching the 2 metre rule. The Heritage Hangar also ceased all ground and flight operations. Well done to all Biggin Hill based operators taking this very seriously and protecting us all from spreading the virus to others.

Private owner flying became a problem too as driving to the airport became classed as non-essential travel, which is no longer permitted. It was also considered unwise to fly in case an incident occurred (like a forced landing), which could make use of emergency services that are needed to cover the needs of coping with Corona Virus victims.

The CAA also confirmed on the day we were going to press that "General Aviation aircraft flying for recreational purposes is NOT permitted in accordance with current Government restrictions".

From medical standpoint, hospitals are cancelling all routine operations to ensure they have the capability and capacity to deal with the anticipated influx of virus victims. GP surgeries are, in the main, closed to personal visits, with most situations being now dealt with remotely via phone services.

Most vacations have had to be cancelled, and new, temporary, hospitals are being opened in exhibition centres to give the NHS more capacity and the ability to cope.....

All in all, an incredibly difficult time for everyone. Please stay well, and stay safe......

#### MARCH WEATHER

The earlier part of March was extremely changeable, with strong crosswinds at times, and periods of low clouds and poor visibility. But of course, all this changed as soon as the Corona Virus "lockdown"

was announced at the beginning of the final week, when we had CAVOK weather every day but couldn't fly now due to the Corona Virus restrictions in force!

#### MONTHLY NEWS FROM THE CEO's OFFICE

Well, when I wrote my latest update towards the end of February, I never envisaged the world would look like it does now. COVID-19 has changed the world, our country and our industry and the word 'unprecedented' cannot be over stated. But what does this mean for the Airport?

London Biggin Hill airport remains open as part of the national transport infrastructure in line with government guidelines. Operationally, the number of flights has dropped significantly, and we are supporting repatriation efforts and essential movement of key personnel. The airport is reviewing all operations daily and we will continue to scrutinise our procedures to ensure government recommendations are implemented.

The Management Team hold daily COVID-19 meetings to review government policy and adapt policies, procedures and practices accordingly. Our focus is to protect the business, protect jobs, protect each other and protect you.

Aviation is one of the most regulated industries in the world, which includes dealing with the current pandemic, and we are following all protocols as advised by the Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) and the UK government. This includes, all non-essential staff working from home, the closure of the Lookout Café, a deep clean and fumigation of all public and administrative facilities, extra cleaning measures throughout the day, and all incoming flights are subject to stringent CAA measures.

The airport is a workplace to over 1,500 local people, supporting local families and in turn local businesses. Our primary goal is to ensure that the safety and employment of our staff, tenant companies, suppliers and contractors is maintained as much as is reasonably practical.

I would like to end by wishing all the very best in these trying times and hope that you remain safe and well.
