ROY (THE PIPE) TAYLOR

As reported in a special Newsletter in early July, former airport manager at Biggin Hill, Roy (the Pipe) Taylor, sadly passed away.

The original Biggin Hill Airport manager working with Sqd Ldr J R "Jock" Maitland, Roy was well known to all who flew and operated at Biggin Hill from the outset in 1959, when everyone moved to the airport from Croydon.

An engineer by profession and a former Royal Navy man, Roy was one of the architects and designers of the original International Air Travel Fairs, which preceded the Air Fair's put on by Jock until relatively recently, and became the largest and most well known privately run air shows in the UK and Europe.

After leaving Biggin Hill, Roy moved to Field Aircraft as an engineer and remained until his retirement. After retirement, Roy subsequently lived close to Lee on Solent.

Roy's funeral, held on the 24th July, was attended by Jim Maitland, Phil Johnson, and Jean Moore, all of whom worked with him in the Biggin Hill days and had remained in contact with him.

A good man who will be missed by his many friends – R.I.P. Roy.

COLIN CADLE

For those who were around in the 60's and in Surrey & Kent Flying Club in the days of Peter Chinn, "Tiny" Marshall, and Harry Croft, some will remember my very close friend, Colin Cadle, who did his PPL there and subsequently attended RAF Cranwell, where he graduated as a pilot.

MONTHLY NEWS FROM THE CEO's OFFICE

Firstly, my apologies for the absence of 'news for the CEO' last month, the shock and disappointment from my regular readers was palpable!

The past 2 months have seen a steady decline in Business traffic across the UK, with Biggin Hill holding its own in what is a highly competitive market. The closure of RAF Northolt has not generated the traffic increase the Airport was expecting and this might also be a result of the continuing concerns over Brexit. That said, the Airport continues to invest in our infrastructure and welcome new operators.

The Airport remains keen to clarify the future strategy for light/general aviation and I hope to hold the first meeting of the Light/General aviation steering group in late August. We will need to address several key areas including flying training, hangers, location and operating procedures. Whilst a few individuals have approached me expressing interest in being involved in the group, I would still welcome approaches for anyone else keen to engage.

Turning to development news, you will all have seen that the work on Charlie taxiway was completed earlier this month and you will also have seen that the resurfacing works on Hotel taxiway are well underway. I would like to thank all our partners for their cooperation and patience whilst we improve our Airport infrastructure. Work continues to deliver the GPS approach for Rwy 03 and now that the NATS hazard analysis is complete, we will be able to submit our safety case to the CAA within the next fortnight.

As many of you might be aware, the Aerospace Technology college received its planning approval last week and we look forward to working with the College to progress this development as soon as practicable. This great news will allow the Airport to progress the Hotel development in parallel with the College subject to any final planning approvals.

As always, I remain committed to meeting as many of our tenants, partners and users as possible; however, if our paths have not crossed yet then please get in touch.
