Many of us were shocked to hear on 20th January of the passing of another Biggin Hill'ite, Roger (the Dog) Taylor. Roger had apparently been ill over Christmas and after the New Year, his condition deteriorated, developing pneumonia, and he was admitted to hospital, where he was kept in an induced coma to help control the condition. Sadly he never recovered.

Roger was a permanent fixture at Biggin Hill for many, many, years and originally learnt to fly at Surrey & Kent on Tomahawks. He was a general handyman and there are very many of us who

have used Roger's skills for household building and repair works. A lovely guy, Roger was always the first person to help out with anything.

He became a kind of resident caretaker and security at Joe's Pilots Pals bar, and could be seen virtually daily propping up the bar with his dog (Max first, and subsequently Otto) in residence in the corner.

Roger's funeral will be held on Friday 8th February at 1.00pm at Walton Lea Crematorium, Chester Road, Warrington, WA4 6TB

Followed by a Reception/wake at Appleton Thorn Village Hall, Stretton Road, Appleton Thorn, Warrington, WA4 4RT (Tel: 01925 261187)

LONDON HELICOPTER ACCIDENT

As everyone will of course be aware, an Augusta A109E twin engine helicopter suffered a collision with a crane close to Vauxhall in Central London on 16th January 2013. Our thoughts and prayers go to the families, friends, and loved ones of the pilot and the pedestrian both of whom lost their lives in this tragic accident.

I am sure that most of you, like me, will have been alarmed by some of the press and TV reports immediately following the accident, many of which certainly appeared to be unnecessarily speculating on what happened, and seeming even reaching conclusions about what should now be done. Clearly such speculation is damaging to the aviation industry in general. (it was clear, in some cases, that so called 'experts' interviewed knew little more than the average man in the street).

For those that are interested, the AAIB have released their preliminary report describing the full facts and circumstances of the accident itself, without of course, at this early stage, making any attempt to speculate on the actual cause. Yet today it is positively spring-like, albeit with rather sporting wind conditions! I would like to thank the team for their dedication, which went way beyond the call of duty, as it often does.

We have started 2013 on a heart-warming note, glad to be part of the Nick Davidson Memorial Flying Scholarship. I didn't know Nick but I am sure many of you did during his days at Surrey and Kent, and I can only admire his courage and generosity in thinking of giving this chance to a young person he had never even met, in order to help them take the first and often least accessible step

towards a flying career. Gary Merchant has been a true friend in ensuring that Nick's wishes are followed through, and I am glad that we are able to help make this happen at Biggin Hill. There have been press releases about it and the various Clubs and youth groups around the Airport have been advised. It would be a shame if someone didn't know about it to apply, so your help in telling your family and friends is much appreciated.

You will recall that we have had some difficulties related to Airside access – something which many airports similar to ours are also facing challenges with at the moment. I offered to waive landing fees as a gesture of good will, following some unnecessary security clearance and training requests. I have just issued the process for this through Surrey & Kent, Alouette, and Maurice Greenaway, who will be passing it on to those concerned. Any further enquiries can be made to our Accounts department during office hours, via the main switchboard on 01959 578500.

Exact requirements for Airside access are still being discussed with the Department for Transport, and this will be advised as soon as it is finalised. John Dugdale, our Safety and Security Manager, retired on 31st December so we currently have the very welcome services of a security consultant, supporting the Security team. We all wish John a long and relaxing retirement.

Another significant change at the beginning of 2013, is that Jet Aviation's business has been taken over by Jets (Biggin Hill) Ltd. This company is owned by Quest, who also own Jets at Bournemouth and 328 Support Services in Germany. Jets is a relatively small, energetic organisation, which specialises in engineering and has some exciting plans for growing the business here at Biggin. They are still in set-up mode, but I am sure will very quickly become a valuable asset for the Airport.
