JANUARY WEATHER

It was so changeable that, at one point the high pressure broke all records, with 1050 Hectopascals at one point, the highest recorded since 1932 apparently!

FEBRUARY BIGGIN HILL POSTED FUEL PRICES

The "posted" Biggin Hill Airport fuel prices, <u>excluding VAT</u>, for the calendar month of February 2020 are:

£1.55 per litre for 100LL Avgas if supplied from the Fuel Bowser (if uplifted using account card or credit card from the Self-Refuel pumps = minus 4p per litre)

£0.645 per litre for Jet A1

DOUGLAS FIELD

I was shocked to hear that old Biggin Hill'ite, Douglas Field, passed away quietly at home on 23rd January with his family by his side.

Douglas owned and flew a VariEze which I believe he built from a kit many years ago. Unfortunately he had an engine failure on the approach into Dunkeswell and landed heavily in a field, receiving severe back injuries. Douglas's wife Mavis was also on board the aircraft, and although injured, she was not badly hurt. He was airlifted to a local hospital, before moving to Stoke Mandeville for further treatment. Douglas eventually returned home but remained paralysed and wheelchair bound.

Ex-Army and MoD man, Douglas was also very active at Biggin Hill Airport, he actively participated on all the monthly airport meetings - including the Airport Users and Tenants group as well as serving on the Airport Consultative Committee, and the SANARB, and he looked after Hangar 504 for the airport's tenants there.

The family indicated that Douglas had become quite ill towards the end in spite of gallantly fighting it. He died at 1am as they said, with much dignity.

He will be much missed by his many aviation and airport colleagues. R.I.P.Douglas

ALOUETTE FLYING CLUB

Took the kids to school this morning and it was freezing! Perhaps there's snow on the way. But that's no bad thing, because that often means clear blue skies, once the snow has landed.

Sure it will be cold until you get that heater on but the views will be spectacular. So let's shake off that winter dust and get back into the air.

Here at Alouette we have two excellent Cessna 172s and instructors waiting for you.

1) For PPL holders....

We have special rates for anyone already holding a PPL:

Free membership until April if you are a paid member of any other flying club

A discounted hourly hire rate:

£175 per tacho hour (equivalent to about £140 per chock to chock hour) plus landing fees – plus instructors fee when appropriate.....

2) Flight Training for Students... (Minimum age 14)

For students, whilst the normal rate is £195 per tacho hour (equivalent to about £156 per chock to chock hour) plus landing fees and the instructors fee, we do offer new potential students the following:

A single one hour chock to chock Trial Lesson for £199 which includes the landing fee and instructor fee.

And after, there is still a subsidised five hour pack available:

5 hours chock to chock flying in the club aircraft

5 hours instruction plus ground briefings

5 landing fees at Biggin Hill

A Pilots Logbook

An aircraft checklist

Free club membership whilst on the 5 hour course for a cost of :-

£1,040

Now that's good value! All landing fees and instructor are included!

After that, assuming you want to continue flight training (which we are sure you will of course), at this point you need to join the club and your subsequent flying is at the normal rate of £195 per tacho hour (equivalent to about £156 per chock to chock hour) plus landing fees and the instructors fee.

Come and try us out - Hope we will see you at our club soon.

MONTHLY NEWS FROM THE CEO's OFFICE

As I write my update the question that springs to mind is 'When is it too late to wish everyone a belated Happy New Year'? Too late I hear you cry, but I feel compelled to do it never the less! So, Happy New Year to all!

A month into the new year has already seen challenges regarding the weather, instrument approaches and the increasing demand for de-icing. As I look out of the window, I see the Airport clouded in low mist, which increases the need for us to invest in a new ILS and progress the 03 GPS Approach. Both of these are key targets for the Airport within the next 12 months.

Despite the continuing narrative of a flat or decreasing market, the Airport continues to perform well against this back drop. Despite a slow start to the year, we see January's movements ahead of both 2019 and 2018. This is promising when you consider this is in the run up to Brexit which is literally just over 24 hours away. We have taken this opportunity to remind our customers and the wider Airport community that it is 'Business as Usual' and we expect to see no immediate impact of Brexit.

This year will see the start of a series of significant developments across the Airport. In February we will see the commencement of the OEM hangar facility south of the RAS hangar. In September we will see the enabling works start for both the Hotel and College, and some of you will already have seen the work underway on taxiway Lima. Together with the work on improving our navigational facilities, this represents a significant investment that will benefit the whole airport community.

The lively debate during our most recent Light Aviation Steering Group regarding what the future of GA at Biggin Hill might look like, was challenging but ultimately constructive. Whilst we all will have very differing views about the future, what is vital is that those debates are now taking place, and that slowly a strategy will emerge.
