THE AIRPORT

Congratulations to all concerned at Biggin Hill Airport for putting Heathrow to shame during the appallingly heavy snow during December. The Olympics are fast approaching and the airport management has released a document that outlines their plans for the airport during that period. This includes changes to the operational hours. Although the application to the council is specific to the period of the Olympics, many local residents, including myself, are concerned that this could be the thin edge of the wedge and that the airport management, once a precedent has been set, could seek to keep these hours beyond the period applicable to the Olympics. The management has not, after all, endeared itself to the local community by the way they have dealt with the air show, and other issues.
