JOHN DOW-SMITH

In early December we received the sad news that Jonathan Dow-Smith (always known to all at Biggin Hill as JDS) passed away.

JDS had always had a passion for aeroplanes and eventually gave up his career and learnt to fly at Surrey & Kent at Biggin Hill Airport, gaining his fixed wing PPL in 1978. In 1988 he went on to gain his Helicopter Pilots Licence at OATS, and that became his passion like nothing else had before. He went on to become a fixed wing flying instructor and also ran the Biggin Hill Flying Club, which became Biggin Hill School of Flying when it became part of the Cabair Group of companies. JDS became a director of Cabair until 1990.

Unfortunately due to failing health, he had to stop flying in the early 1990's, but his love of flying was ingrained into his soul by then, and this love of aviation remained with him for the rest of his life.

JDS was very much a fighter. He never gave up despite numerous hurdles that he had to overcome. Renowned as a quite harsh taskmaster when running BHSF, he was, nevertheless a thoroughly decent man who was respected by almost all who came into contact with him.

His funeral was held on Tuesday 11 December at Kemnal Park and was attended by several old Biggin Hill colleagues.

MONTHLY REPORT FROM THE OFFICE OF WILL CURTIS

Following a very average October and November, December has been a busy month for business aviation with movements up 15% on December 2017. Light aviation has been hampered by the weather, but has put in an average showing for the time of year.

There is really very little to report this month. Work continues on the runway 03 approach lighting system with a gantry to be installed on the other side of the road in the early New Year. It will not be visible as it will be located on the brow of the steep bank that lies south west of the threshold. Once installed, the lighting should make the runway easier to locate at night and in poor weather. The GPS approach for runway 03 sits with the CAA pending approval, we hope, in due course.

Our IRVR system has had a software upgrade and should now meet CAA requirements and enter service at last. The work on the Hotel taxiway has been tendered and prices received. Final contractual adjustments are being made and we then hope to commence work, ideally to be completed before the busy summer period. We have elected to defer the link taxiway on the basis of time available, so this will follow later.

There have been no major safety issues to report, but an AA5 burst a nosewheel tire on landing and various people were vocal regarding the cause of the damage, citing the runway condition as the cause. However, a short time after this incident, a piece of FOD was discovered on the runway during and inspection. It appears to be a conical nose wheel bearing of the type fitted to an AA5 nosewheel. This therefore becomes an aircraft maintenance issue and the SANARB has asked the airport Safety Manager to investigate the matter further and trace it back to the maintenance provider and follow it through its internal safety system.

We decided to open on Boxing Day this year, but for turbine and piston twin types only. This was to minimise noise nuisance to local residents who are used to the airport being closed on Boxing Day. We will review this after the New Year and decide whether to open on Boxing Day 2019 and if so what types to accommodate.

It only remains for me to wish you all a very Happy, prosperous, and healthy New Year!
