JANUARY BIGGIN HILL POSTED FUEL PRICES

The "posted" Biggin Hill Airport fuel prices, excluding VAT, for the calendar month of January 2020 are:

£1.56 per litre for 100LL Avgas if supplied from the Fuel Bowser (if uplifted using account card or credit card from the Self-Refuel pumps = minus 4p per litre)

£0.649 per litre for Jet A1

Peter apparently learned to fly at Surrey and Kent in the late 70's, and continued to fly there into the early 80's. Biggin Hill'ite Simon Rooney said "We'd both been plane mad school friends, and lost touch. I was so pleased to discover his name on G-AXSD's booking sheet!"

Peter then moved over to Ireland to instruct, and subsequently became airport manager at Waterford, before returning to instruct at Wexford.

Peter, and another colleague, died when their Rollason Condor aircraft crashed on the 6th October 2019.

Peter's family have been very touched by the level of respect and affection that has been expressed by the light aviation community - not just in Ireland......

MONTHLY NEWS FROM THE CEO's OFFICE

As this year draws to a close, I cannot believe 10 months has passed since I joined the Airport on the 1st March 2019. It is a year that has seen significant growth at the Airport and changes that position it and the whole Airport community for further growth and change over this coming decade. My fingers remain crossed that the weather doesn't hold a nasty surprise at the start of this coming new year.

Despite the market remaining challenging over the past 12 months, the Airport continues to hold its own and maintain just short of 20% of the London market. The Airport continues to attract traffic, reinforcing our position as London's Business aviation gateway to the capital and a home base for both private and commercial operators. That said, the Airport must maintain its focus on proving outstanding customer service and adapting to our customers changing demands.

Now that Hotel taxiway is fully operational, our attention can turn to other areas of the manoeuvring area that require re surfacing and repair. During the upcoming year we need to focus on delivering the new GPS 03 Approach and replacing the ILS on Runway 21. Additionally, we will be progressing the GPS approach for Runway 21.

The Airport will continue to review its investment priorities over the next 12 months. Next year will see significant developments 'break ground' across the Airport including the Airport hotel, Technical College and hangar facility.

I look forward to the Light Aviation Steering Group increasing its influence next year and helping to shape the future integration of light aviation at Biggin Hill. We will continue to explore ways in which we can improve our communications and engagement across the Airport site.
