## **EMPIRE AIR DAY – RAF KENLEY**

7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> September – RAF Kenley celebrates the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the 1938 Empire Air Day and once again the aerodrome will come alive to the sound of 1930's fighter aircraft to raise money for the RAF Benevolent Fund.

Saturday programme includes an Aero Jumble and Aviation Collectors event where you can buy everything from Aviation Art to Aircraft Parts! Ground displays include Brooklands Museum's Sopwith Camel, two Spitfire Mk1 replicas, and collection of Gliders from the Vintage / Historic Gliding Club. Other attractions include RAF and 1930's re-enactment, aeroautojumble, classic cars and bikes, steam fair, Alan Cobham Display, Air League and fly pasts all day, these will include 1930's airliners flying to Croydon

The day will end with a full Big Band Swing Dance with The Conchord Big Band performing as the WWII Retro Big Band in the uniforms of the Glenn Miller Army Airforce Band. They will be playing the iconic music of the 30s and 40s, and will be covering numbers by Glenn Miller, Benny Goodman, Duke Ellington, Tommy Dorsey, Artie Shaw and the Andrew Sisters, to mention but a few
