BHA COMMUNITY OFFICE

The 2015 Biggin Hill Festival of Flight returned with a bigger audience, 18,000, and a more traditional format for the flying display. Despite the weathers best attempts the flying display was generally well received in particular the closing formation Spitfire display flown by Paul Bonhomme and Steve Jones, I think we have found Ray Hanna's successors. The new traffic management company, Topher, were a vast improvement on 2015 and a number of areas have been identified to make further improvements for next year.

As you all know tickets sold out 10 days before the event, demand was unprecedented and with the number of complimentary responses we have received I am sure this will now be the norm rather than the exception. A date for next year's diary, we have confirmed the 18th June 2016 for next year's Festival of Flight, thank you for your support this year and if you couldn't make this year I hope we will see you in 2016.

We now look to the 18th August when the gates of the airport open again for the commemoration of the Hardest Day during the Battle of Britain. Organised by the airport and the Heritage Hangar the event will see 24 Spitfires and Hurricanes gather at Biggin Before setting of in three flights of eight aircraft to replicate the main sorties of the 18th August 1940. Tickets have been limited to 3,000 with proceeds being donated to the RAF Benevolent Fund. Tickets are available online only via www.biggin75.co.uk.

EFG has a new neighbour which it is hoped will open its doors early July, the Lookout Café. In response to the recent public consultation the former Cabair flying club building has undergone extensive refurbishment. With its garden viewing area the café will be open 7 days a week to serve Tea, Costa coffee, sandwiches, Paninis, cream teas and the like. A new manager has been appointed along with three new part timer members of staff who will be joined by the airport café bar staff when the airport facility closes down as part of the terminal refurbishment.

MONTHLY REPORT FROM THE OFFICE OF WILL CURTIS

June has been a busy month for all forms of aviation and we are at last seeing some small growth in the business aviation sector after 5 years of a very flat market. This is a most welcome development.

We continue to negotiate the Council over the requisite controls on noise that we must put in place if we are to take advantage of our extended operating hours. We anticipate that this process will take a few months more and I will keep you posted as to progress.

The new booking out system is now in the final stages of testing and should be released before too much longer. When this is introduced, it should speed up the process of getting airborne and ensure that we always have the details of your flight before you depart, thus allowing us to handle overdue action more effectively if it becomes necessary. Iphone and Android apps will follow shortly and this will allow even easier access to the system.

The Festival of Flight went well this year with 18,000 people turning out despite the weather. Indeed, poor weather to the north of London kept the Blenheim and B17 (Sally 'B') at Duxford and Paul Bonhomme's S Bach on the ground at Audley End, leaving Steve Jones to perform solo in his S Bach. The RAF Chinook also went tech at RAF Northolt. For me, the highlight of the day was seeing Steve Jones and Paul Bonhomme fly a duo in Spitfires. It was a masterclass in formation flying and quite the best Spitfire formation I have seen so far - a really special way to close the show! Lastly, it is my happy duty to thank Colin Hitchins and his team for putting on such a memorable and well run show. Thank you Colin.

I wish I was there to put them on for you the first time, as no doubt many other hands will touch them before I have a chance to see you again.


When you take them off remember to blow into them a little bit because they will be naturally a little damp from wearing.
