STOP PRESS

Just before publishing this Newsletter, the Government has finally published confirmation that the GA leisure flying and Flight Training and clubs/schools are approved to recommence from 4th July 2020, subject to the restrictions included within their website. The CAA then confirmed the changes.

JUNE WEATHER

GENERAL AVIATION RESTRICTIONS EASING?

As I write this Newsletter, the UK's Department for Transport has literally just indicated that the restrictions on General Aviation flying and Flight Training are about to be eased. The DfT letter says that we should be able to get back to leisure flying, and Flight Training, from 4th July, albeit with some restrictions yet to be published.

However the CAA seems to currently be in denial of the existence of this relaxation of the restrictions applied by them under DfT instruction some months ago! As at this moment, the CAA does not accept anything has changed!

JULY BIGGIN HILL POSTED FUEL PRICES

The "posted" Biggin Hill Airport fuel prices, excluding VAT, for the calendar month of July 2020 are:

£1.36 per litre for 100LL Avgas if supplied from the Fuel Bowser (if uplifted using account card or credit card from the Self-Refuel pumps = minus 4p per litre)

£0.49 per litre for Jet A1

BOMBARDIER NEW HANGAR AND FACILITY

As regular users of the airport will, of course, realise, the huge new facility being built by Bombardier at the airport is well under way.

The complex will occupy the land between the self-refuelling facility and the old, now closed, Runway 29 in front of where the old civilian control tower of the 60's was located by the South East Apron.

In the last week or so, the metal internal structure has started to be erected, and the associated office facilities and ramp space will follow.

JOHN CHRISTLIEB

Just a few days ago we were informed of the sad passing of another old Biggin Hill'ite, John Christlieb. Although I do personally remember John from those early days at the airport, I will leave one of our airport's old flying instructors, Harry Harris, from Vendair Flying Club, to tell of John's long involvement with Biggin Hill and with his personal close friendship over 60 years....

Quote...... John and I first met around 1962 when he came to our Vendair Flying Club to take lessons. He was a very rich businessman running a highly profitable import/export business based in Lagos Nigeria. He made numerous trips back to the UK on business. He had just got divorced from his first wife and was looking for something to do to fill the vacuum.

Later on when he was just about ready to go solo and whilst doing some touch & go's on Rwy 23 another aircraft, a 4-engined DH Heron was also doing some training T&Gs on the long runway. The pilot had stopped both starboard engines and with full flap down attempted to go-around - he never made it! The Heron hit some lamp standards on the main road and turned upside down crashing in the valley below killing both pilots. John of course witnessed all this but I still sent him on his first solo later on before he had time to reflect on it.

I was also teaching a young university student called Juliette Thomson to fly at the same time. For her 21st birthday her rich father bought her our lovely Auster 5 (G-AKXP) and we operated it for her. Both John and her later got married but divorced around 18 months later.

During his numerous UK business trips he always found time to visit Biggin and finished up joining us at our evening sessions playing brag at Sid's 'Stick & Rudder' bar adjoining Surrey & Kent's offices. One day I persuaded him to do a parachute jump out of XP. He later claimed to have done two jumps - his first and his last!

John was also a very adept yachtsman who owned his own yacht. He made at least two trips across the Atlantic in it. On one occasion he sailed through the rivers and canal system of France to the

port of Marseilles and whilst docking it he accidentally scraped another yacht moored there and owned by an experienced Dutch yachtswoman called Etonella. To placate her he not only footed the repair bill but also invited her to join him for dinner at an exclusive restaurant to which she agreed. They later on got married, which lasted 45 years until his untimely death two days ago (no details of his funeral as yet). They produced a daughter named Ejola who later became a successful lawyer.

As well as owning a salubrious marina called Melfort Pier on the west coast of Scotland where he and Etonella spent their summers, he also owned a luxurious property at Palm Beach Florida where the pair of them spent their winters before returning back to Scotland in the Spring.

Unfortunately in his later years John developed Peripheral Neuropathy in his feet and was confined to a wheelchair. This didn't stop the pair of them from swanning around the globe in luxurious ocean liners on which they invariably had dinner at the captain's table.

A few years back my Thai wife Tuk and I visited John and Etonella at Melfort Pier. They were very impressed with Tuk.

Having now known John for almost 60 years during which time we had many a tale to tell each other of our experiences I feel a great loss at his departure.

MONTHLY NEWS FROM THE CEO's OFFICE

I opened last month's submission to the newsletter with a reference to whether you were optimistic or pessimistic about the lifting of lockdown measures and the potential for a second spike and I find myself doing the same this month. I am pleased that the restrictions on General Aviation have been further lifted and that flying training will commence in the next few days and I wait with great anticipation to hear formal confirmation of the establishment of travel corridors to ease the industry out of full quarantine. Again, wherever you positional yourself, our industry will not return to pre COVID-19 levels for some time if at all.

As I stated in my update last month, London Biggin Hill airport remains open as part of the national transport infrastructure in line with government guidelines. Operationally, the number of flights has increased throughout June although we still remain well below the traffic levels we would normally expect at this time of year. Although we have fared better than most scheduled airports, we continue to trade at a loss.

Notwithstanding the impact of COVID-19, those of you who have been at the Airport will have seen the start of the steel structure for the Bombardier Hangar start to raise from the ground. This is a welcomed sight and, together we confirmation that the new ILS will be installed in October, it is further proof of the Airport's commitment to expand and provide enhanced facilities for its tenants and operators. We hope to see the ground works for our Hotel start towards the end of September this year.

Although there are clear signs that lockdown restrictions are easing, the Airport continues to engage with central government, DfT and the CAA regarding quarantine measures. The Airport continues to engage with its customers to ensure they are fully aware of the measures that have been taken to ensure their safety whilst travelling from the Airport and I will, very shortly, being announcing a further initiative to reinforce this.

I would like to end by wishing all the very best in these trying times and hope that you remain safe and well.
