Government and Politicians stupidity

We are told by the government that the cost of bank bail outs (or "whoops... how do I shore up my investment in Charlie's bank - oh yes I'll just use some of Joe Public's money and then I can sell my crap shares to the tax payer ...thank you very much - that'll do nicely").

Every working man and woman in the country knows that borrowing money to get out of financial straights doesn't work and only, in the long run, makes things worse. We can safely exclude Ministers for the description of "working men and women as none of them have actually done a days' work in a wealth generating company. They have set about selling the family silver to pay for the party we've just had. Our country is bankrupt - in other words we cannot meet our commitments as they fall due. We have no export industry and since the collapse of the

financial sector (which theoretically exported billions in financial services) our balance of trade deficit – the difference between the cost of imports and the value of exports – has deteriorated to an alarming extent. Government figures showed that British industry did actually produce a lawnmower last year, somewhere near Coventry, but it broke down as soon as its new owner got it home and by the time he could say "warranty" the manufacturer had collapsed.

So the government have come up with another "big idea". They will print more money! Genius! Except not really because then the pound devalues further and imports get more expensive. Because we don't make anything ourselves, we buy everything from abroad. So if the pound gets weaker everything gets more expensive. Prices in the high street go up because they have to – the supplier had to pay more for them at import. That is called price inflation and that leads to... oh shit - not such a great idea after all.

So - we don't earn enough to keep Britain PLC afloat and we have borrowed more money than you or I can even visualise or could spend in a lifetime spent in a Ferrari dealership. We are told we will need GBP 39 billion a year for ten years to pay this back. But with everyone out of work there is no tax take and a socking great social security bill so maybe we'll just have to print more money?

There is another way! How I hear you cry - what possible solution?

Well - we currently pay Europe GBP 300 billion a year to help some far flung former CIS country to build new roads and French farmers to make a hundred grand a year off half an acre of garlic. We pay an incredible GBP 104,000 a minute to Brussels and for what. We are told that this is a great deal - that the without European trade we would have to shed millions of UK jobs. But that isn't right - we have a GBP 60 billion trade deficit with Europe - in other words we buy from them GBP 60 billion more each year than they buy from us. For instance the UK is the biggest market after the US worldwide for German cars. And the truth is that we have to buy from them because, as we are part of the EU, there are trade tariffs preventing outsiders from competing fairly for our custom.

If you take away all that nonsense you end up with a spare GBP 300 billion a year. We can begin to rebuild the collapsed and derelict infrastructure of the UK - the potholes, the railways, the hospitals, and schools and prisons that we so badly need. That equals new jobs and new jobs equals good news, a bigger tax take for the treasury and a more buoyant economy.

And if we begin to import goods tariff free because we have free trade agreements with countries such as the US and our own commonwealth, our import prices drop and our high street prices follow. Inflation drops too - now that's more like it...

There is only one problem. How do we remove ourselves from Europe and the 97,000 new laws and regulations that they have quietly foisted on us over the past 20 years? Well it won't be easy but it can be done if the British public choose to make it happen. There are political parties that are firmly committed to removing us form the Lisbon Treaty (formerly called the European Constitution) and from the strictures of Europe, and Conservative MP William Haig appears to have "suggested" that if they are elected they would hold a referendum on the matter. However, as this came from a politician, we can guess that they are lying because their lips are moving. We need to see it in writing!

Gordon Brown already signed the Lisbon Treaty - they had to force him to go as he felt a bit uneasy because in so doing he pledged the sovereignty of the United Kingdom to a foreign power without the mandate of the public. That used to be called high treason for which you could, until very recently, still be executed. But not to worry because shortly before he went to sign the treaty he and Blair changed the law and removed treason from the list of offences for which one could be executed - just in case, you understand! (Wouldn't want to end up wearing a blindfold at dawn like some poor ex Romanian President).

In the end we have only been saved from the ratification of the treaty by the Irish who voted NO. We were not allowed to vote on the matter. Yes, the Labour Party manifesto promised us a referendum on the European Constitution. But now it is called the Lisbon Treaty - well - that's different and you can't have your say about that. You see, the deal is that Tony steps down, Gordon gets to be PM which he wanted so badly he would have done anything - even an act of treason - Tony takes a couple of years off, doesn't screw his historical legacy by being the clown that actually signed it, but instead gets to be the first president of the EU for organising the idiot to sign. If we want to change the future of Britain then we have to act - vote for a party that will put Britain's interests first, or at the very least contact your prospective MEP and your MP and ask them to push for a harder line on Europe.
