It with great sadness that I have to report the loss of another old Biggin Hill'ites, Ray (Mac) McElwain on 11th May. His wife, Daphne, wrote: "Ray suffered much illness in the past, but for the last few months he had been so much better and very active. It was a great shock for me as, after taking him a morning coffee because he wanted to get up and mow the lawn, when I popped my head in to tell him I was off shopping, I found he had slipped away."

Ray lived near York but had previously been an active Biggin Hill'ite, flying with Rex Nicholls and Peter Elliott at the Experimental Flying Group, where he regained his pilots licence in the late 60's and early 70's. He was also active in the Scout movement, along with Scott-Chard, regularly flying scouts at weekends mainly in his case from Blackbushe, which was closer to his then home.

His hobby in recent years had been working as a volunteer at Yorkshire Air Museum at Elvington, York , where he was involved in the building, rebuilding and restoring aircraft historic aircraft. These included involvement on such aircraft as a Dragonfly Helicopter (see <u>www.helicopterpreservation.co.uk</u>), Fairchild Argus, SE5, C47 Dakota, and a WW1 light Naval Fighter, the Eastchurch Kitten. He has also been the President of the Yorkshire Helicopter Preservation Group based at the old Doncaster Airport, Aeroventure.
