GASCo SAFETY EVENING

Thursday 26th February saw around 80 pilots attending one of the excellent General Aviation Safety Council's Safety Evenings, hosted by Biggin Hill Airport at the Main Terminal. The theme of the meeting was the "GA Safety Six" – Runway Excursions (they really were "ex"cursions, not incursions as many mistakenly thought was intended!), Airspace Infringements, Controlled Flight into Terrain, Airborne Conflict, and Loss of Control, with Human Factors running right through the entire group.

The speaker made the evening amusing, whilst getting the point across, and used a number of very entertaining but thought provoking slides and particularly videos. There were some prizes awarded, plus each attendee received a full pack including leaflets containing much that was in the slides. Additionally, on exit and giving in their feedback form, each person received a very useful AFE "Cockpit Companion" booklet.

AIRPORTS UNDER THREAT AGAIN

Not satisfied with closing Manston, Panshangar, and West Malling (and these just in our immediate vicinity), Flyer Magazine has now announced that Cotswold Airport (formerly Kemble) is now under threat:

QUOTE....

Plans are in place which propose the development of privately-owned Cotswold Airport (formerly Kemble) for 2,000 homes and other services, creating a 'new, sustainable village'.

FLYER contacted Cotswold Airport management for a comment on the plans, but were referred to Tristan Fitzgerald Associates (TFA) who issued us with a press release which explains, 'As part of the Local Plan process, Commercial Estates Group (CEG), a company who actively develop and manage land and property in the UK are making representations to show how Kemble Airfield can help the council sustainably meet its housing supply.'

When FLYER asked whether Cotswold Airport's owners were actively pursuing the development, and if CEG were working on the proposal on their behalf, TFA answered, 'CEG are working in partnership with the landowner and have entered into a long term agreement to promote the airfield through the planning system.

Also in the release, Matthew Tunley of CEG comments, "Kemble Airfield provides an opportunity to create a new sustainable village of around 2,000 homes alongside shops and services, education, leisure facilities and employment. This could be a very special place and deliver a wide range of benefits including parking for Kemble Station and improving broadband connectivity in surrounding villages."

The General Aviation airport is currently occupied by aircraft hangars, two runways, and industrial and commercial units. Kemble Enterprise Park, which accommodates a wide range of business units, adjoins the site to the south. Cotswold District Council is currently consulting on the Local Plan and further consultation will take place later in the Spring/Summer.

A website is being constructed to include the representations made to Cotswold District Council - www.kembleairfield.com. More details as they become available.UNQUOTE

I know there are many others also under threat around the UK – where will this all stop?

MONTHLY REPORT FROM THE OFFICE OF WILL CURTIS

We are hopefully nearly through the winter months and without a repeat of the drenching we received last winter. We have seen good number so of light aircraft movements through the winter which has been pleasing.

You are all aware of the ongoing Council consultation which will run until the 13th of March. If you have not already completed the Council's survey in support of our plans, please do so at www.bromley.gov.uk/bigginhillairport

The usual band of angry anti-airport campaigners are out and about stuffing their lies through resident's letter boxes and preaching doom and gloom as usual. These people do not care about jobs or the future of Bromley youngsters, which is sad because we need to do everything we can for our next generation and we need the Council to increase its revenues to pay for public services, including care for the elderly, which are currently facing the axe.

Some in the light aviation community have asked me "what's in it for us" and I think this is a very good question that perhaps I have not answered adequately before. I will try to do so! We are committed to maintaining a vibrant and thriving light aviation sector at Biggin Hill for as long as light aviation wants to be at Biggin Hill. I am well aware that massive investment is required to bring our GA facilities up to a standard that we would all, in the 21st century, hope to provide. We have prepared concept plans for a program of improvements to East Camp which will, in the longer term, provide better GA facilities. We are studying the benefits of American style T-hangars and we have drawn up plans for new access roads and car parking to the west of the East Camp Hangar line. Of course, all this will require some serious investment over the coming years and this will therefore rely, at least to some extent, upon the Council approving our requested changes.

We carried out our own consultation in the autumn of 2014 and one of the many things local residents told us was that they would like a public viewing area at the airport. I believe that this is a good idea - it removes the mystery and mistrust from the airport and allow local residents to see what we actually do here. It may also inspire some young boys and girls to learn to fly when they grow up, which can only be a good thing. So, in the spring, we will open a small cafe and viewing area using the old Cabair flying school building. There will be an outside viewing area with appropriate fencing and this will be situated such that it does not overlook either EFG or Rizon facilities. We hope that this will be the first step in providing facilities for pilots to gather for a chat.
