CORONA VIRUS PANDEMIC

As most current airport users will of course be aware, April has been subject to very obvious restrictions for all forms of light aircraft "recreational flying", which the CAA have made clear is not permitted.

There was a slight relaxation of this restriction towards the end of the month, when it became possible, in some circumstances to pre-clear special maintenance test flights once a month and this included aircraft that had new engines recently fitted that need regular flights to enable the engine to fully "bed in". (special permission is required from the airport, and the flights should normally not exceed 30 minutes and no further than 10 miles from the airport, and no more frequently than one flight a month. No training is permitted on these flights.

All club training and PPL flying has been grounded and the airport's clubs closed to prevent breaching the Social Distancing requirements and to obviously discourage unnecessary and non-essential travel.

The airport is still open as a Port of Entry for commercial flying and essential flights carrying such items as PPE for the NHS and other care facilities.

Hopefully, as things improve more and show a consistent downward trend on hospital attendances and deaths from the virus, we may start to see a slow relaxation of restrictions, but this is likely to be relatively slow once this starts. It is highly unlikely that things will suddenly revert completely to previrus normality.

APRIL WEATHER

From the very changeable and often unflyable weather in the early part of the year, pretty much from the point of the start of the Corona Virus formal Lockdown, the weather changed and has been consistently CAVOK (until today as I write this!). Such a shame no one can make use of it to enjoy light aircraft flying in the sunshine. Hopefully in time this lockdown will be relaxed allowing us to enjoy our hobby again (although judging by how everything normally goes, that's when the weather will change and we will have unpleasant conditions again!)

MAY BIGGIN HILL POSTED FUEL PRICES

The "posted" Biggin Hill Airport fuel prices, excluding VAT, for the calendar month of May 2020 are:

£1.17 per litre for 100LL Avgas if supplied from the Fuel Bowser (if uplifted using account card or credit card from the Self-Refuel pumps = minus 4p per litre)

£0.41 per litre for Jet A1

BILL WUNDERLICH

It is with great sadness that I report the passing of old Biggin Hill'ite, Bill Wunderlich, who at age 87 died early on Monday morning this week.

Bill became interested in Aviation as a 14 year old Air Cadet. Some years later whilst running his new business, Automotive Engineering Services with his wife in Bromley, the family often visited Biggin Hill Airport with the family on Sundays to watch the aircraft. In 1970 he learnt to fly at South London Aero Club at Biggin, which is where he first met his lifelong friend Bill Webb.

He originally was a cinema projectionist before moving into wireless, where he was tutored by the well know wireless inventor and broadcasting pioneer of the time, Captain Peter Eckersley. He went on to working in the oil industry throughout the world, before running his own business until his retirement around three years ago. Throughout the years he held and used an amateur radio licence.

He was a CAA licenced aircraft engineer and his knowledge about aircraft engines and airframes was Unrivalled. A great friend of Singh Bamrah who tells me that, over the years, he owned a number of different aircraft, including a Cessna F150J G-AWSD and a Piper PA28-140 G-ASSW, which he totally rebuilt from scratch.

In recent years he suffered from two strokes the last of which caused immense damage, which is why he was latterly in a care home, where he died of Covid-19 and other infections.

Bill's name has been added to the Biggin Hill Reunited Roll of Honour – he will be missed by his many friends at the airport - R.I.P. Bill

MONTHLY NEWS FROM THE CEO's OFFICE

The reference to 'unprecedented times' has been used more often in the past 4 weeks than probably any of us would have expected in a year and never was a phrase more appropriate. COVID-19 has changed our landscape globally as well as nationally. The Aviation industry post COVID-19 could well be unrecognisable from its pre-crisis state.

As I stated in my update last month, London Biggin Hill airport remains open as part of the national transport infrastructure in line with government guidelines. Operationally, the number of flights has dropped significantly and we are operating at traffic levels at 40% of what we would normally be experiencing.

I appreciate this is a frustrating time for the GA community. The lockdown restrictions and the justification criteria for essential flights are all the more difficult to accept given the beautiful weather experienced throughout April. That said, the Airport is under severe scrutiny to ensure all flights are essential and meet with government, DfT and CAA guidelines.

We have received a significant number of requests to fly for the purpose of maintenance and that is why we issued the revised guidance we had received from the CAA. Each PPR request should clearly state under which CAA guidance they believe their particular flight complies. Once approved, it is the pilot's responsibility to ensure the flight complies with the CAA guidance.

We are engaging actively with central government, DfT and the CAA regarding discussions covering restart and recovery and we will ensure the interests of both the business and general aviation communities are represented. As this moment in time, it is difficult, if not impossible, to predict the recovery strategy. We will keep you informed and thank you for your patience.

I would like to end by wishing all the very best in these trying times and hope that you remain safe and well.
