CHANGES AT BIGGIN HILL AIRPORT

This month the rumour mill is running at full speed and if all we hear is correct, then the changes are certainly not for the better.

There are very strong rumours suggesting that Jet Aviation, once the airport's pride when this global business was attracted to Biggin, have experienced a downturn requiring them to take stock. Many of these rumours suggested that all their staff have been given notice, and that the company is closing down at the airport.

As usual, not all one hears is correct, and the following statement was provided by Jet Aviation in response to my query about the company's likely plans:

"At Biggin Hill, Jet Aviation has initiated a consultation period with its employees a couple of weeks ago. This will last a minimum of 30 days. Jet Aviation is currently evaluating various options, including

- downsizing at Biggin Hill
- selling the operation or
- closing it.

We are currently receiving suggestions and ideas from employees on how to continue the operation at Biggin Hill and will evaluate them while at the same time we also evaluate our other options. The consultation period will end in October by which we hope to provide our employees with more clear answers about the future of the operation at Biggin Hill"

I am very grateful for their help in providing us with the real facts so that unqualified comments are not allowed to damage the company's future at the airport. Jet Aviation is a prestigious and well respected global business. To lose them from the airport would be a sad loss indeed, so we hope they are able to find a satisfactory workaround that will still involve them remaining at Biggin. We wish them well..

Scottish Charter business, Air Charter Scotland, who opened a base at the airport not that long ago, and took on a hangar at the airport, appear to be giving up their hangar and moving into a small slot offered by one of the other hangarage companies at Biggin – at least there is a positive there for one airport tenant.

Long term airport business, Avtech, who have experienced many changing fortunes over the years are, we are lead to believe, giving up their final hangar. At this time, we don't know what their plans are for the future, but we all, I am sure, would wish them well.

We are also told that a business supplying VIP aircraft catering at the airport is also closing down.

All this is happening at the time that businesses have a threat of massive rate increases hanging over their heads. Although still under review by the Rating Authorities, one wonders whether this threat was the final straw that broke the camel's back with these airport based companies.

On the plus side, Perfect Aviation has moved into larger premises at the airport, moving from the small hangar between the Heritage hangar and Avalon to the old Gold Air hangar and office suit, recently vacated by Premier. And the Heritage hangar (the Red Hangar) now boasts an amazing collection of airworthy Spitfires and other similar equipment based at Biggin, and these wonderful aircraft can be seen flying very regularly at the airport.

CONCESSION CHANGES

Regretfully it has become necessary to remove one of the most popular concessions for Card holding Biggin Hill Airport Social Club members.

The Montien (Thai restaurant) in Westerham and several other locations, has offered the generous discount since the club first started issuing photocards. Whilst the owner of all the Montien restaurants has confirmed on several occasions that he wanted to keep the concession running, his local staff in Westerham seemed to have other ideas, and have been refusing to acknowledge the existence of the concession when claimed. As a result, several members have been unable to benefit from the discount at the time of paying the bill, and have drawn my attention to the problem. It is clearly embarrassing when this happens, as I personally have no control over the situation, other than to draw the owner's attention again and again to the problem. I have decided therefore to tell the owner that we no longer require the concession for members, and it has now been removed from the website.

The concessionary discounts do work well in the other restaurants and services, and I have personally used the card quite frequently in the Napoli in Westerham and Dizzy's Diner in Beckenham. The discount has always been honoured without question in these places, and it has saved significant sums, considerably more than the cost of membership.

If anyone has a favourite restaurant that they can obtain a discount for their fellow members, please let me know and I will confirm it in writing to the management, provide them with a sample card for the noticeboard, and promote them on our websites.

SEPTEMBER AT BIGGIN HILL - FROM THE OFFICE OF JENNY MUNRO

With Olympics and Paralympics now behind us, I can with complete relief say that it went extremely well operationally. Overall movements were in fact lower in July and August than they were in those months last year, but this was entirely driven by light aircraft and helicopters operating less than usual. In general, we found that the business traffic was to some extent replacement traffic and not as heavily incremental as had been anticipated. Having said this, the business aircraft movements were very healthy and we were pleased to be able to advise our staff of an Olympics bonus last week as a thank you for their good spirited acceptance of an unusually busy summer with no leave.

Immediately following the Olympics, we were into final preparation for a very successful Business Aircraft Europe Show and then an equally successful CAA Aerodrome Audit, both of which took place in September. Over previous months, work and discussions have been ongoing regarding a possible Air Event in 2013. At this stage, I would say that it is highly unlikely that an Air Event

would take place next year, but this doesn't stop us working on options for 2014 and this continues. Options and ideas are still under discussion for a Social Club, but these are commercially sensitive at this stage – more news on that when I can say more.

Of course you will have heard that Jet Aviation is reviewing its options at Biggin. Again, I am bound by confidentiality but I hope that Jet have been able to make a statement direct to John. All I can say is that we continue to work with them to ensure the best possible outcome for the team, and in cooperation with Jet, identify any opportunities
