MONTHLY REPORT FROM THE OFFICE OF WILL CURTIS

September has been dominated by the 75th anniversary of the Battle of Britain. But aside from that we have had an active month on the part of flying clubs and an average month in respect of business aviation.

Lighting works at the stop end of runway 21 continue and we expect them to be complete before too much longer.

We understand from the Council that it intends to finalise our application for revised aerodrome operating hours in mid-November - over 1 year after our application was first submitted. The new Noise Action Plan will offer protections to local residents where none currently exist, and will ensure that Biggin Hill Airport cannot grow to become a large noisy commercial airport in the future. We hope that the Council will approve our plans, but your support when the next Council meeting takes place will be much appreciated.

Hopefully you will never have cause to see it close up, but we have recently purchased a new fire appliance to replace one of the older units. This forms part of an ongoing strategy to upgrade our hardware where we can and we continue this drive, which has included a new aircraft de-icing rig, a new tractor and new Operations and Security vehicles. We are committed to remaining operational in all weathers and now have better snow clearance capability too having purchased various equipment from the now defunct Manston Airport.

The Lookout Café now offers fresh homemade sandwiches and hot meals for those looking for Refreshment, and we serve Costa coffee and other beverages too. If you haven't yet tried the "Lookout" we would be pleased to welcome you there.
