INEXPENSIVE TRAFFIC INFORMATION FOR GA?

I'm sure that many of you will have already heard of this, but in case not, a quick introduction to a relatively new system known as PilotAware.

PilotAware is a small portable and affordable unit that works with a number of pilot aids such as Sky Demon, RunwayHD, EasyVFR, Air Navigation Pro, Sky-Map, and XC Soar, to provide visual and audio traffic information on aircraft that are equipped with ADS-B, Mode C/S, and also other aircraft with PilotAware – a kind of poor man's VFR TCAS. Whilst it will not in any way eliminate proper lookout, it should certainly help give advanced warnings for some of the traffic out there in the busy London area lower airspace.

The current introductory price is just £159.99 plus VAT and shipping – a small price to pay if it helps us to spot aircraft earlier that might otherwise have been missed. And remember, by design, as it sees other PilotAware equipped aircraft, the more people using PilotAware, the more information will be available to all of us...

REPORT FROM THE OFFICE OF THE COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT MANAGER

2017 will be an important year for London Biggin Hill Airport as we celebrate our centenary. Under the banner 'Biggin Hill 100' we are planning a number of special events and activities.

Our most significant event will be the Festival of Flight. This will see the return of a two-day air show to Biggin on the 19th & 20th of August. Why August you may ask, well we already host the RAF display teams on that weekend for the Eastbourne Air Show and August is a quieter time for the business and therefore easier for us to accommodate add a second day to our Festival of Flight.

A Biggin 100 project team has been put together to look at other events and opportunities. We are already compiling a Biggin100 book, so please do share with us and special memories or pictures. We will look to announce the full Biggin 100 programme of events later this year.

Battle of Britain week was especially busy and productive for us this year.

We aspire to open a branch of the Royal Aeronautical Society here in 2017 and as a precursor to this; we held our first RAeS event here on Monday 12 September.

Peter Monk allowed us to host a very special evening in his Heritage Hangars where we hosted some of our industries key movers and shakers. Our guest of honour was HRH Prince Michael of Kent, Patron of the British Business and General Aviation Association. The lecture, delivered by Ernie Edwards, Chief Operating Officer of the US based Arion Corporation, was on the subject of 'the future of supersonic business aviation'.

The following day the terminal hangar hosted Air Charter Expo (ACE16), with the majority of our resident companies exhibiting alongside many others from the UK and overseas. We hosted over 50 exhibitors, 20 business aircraft and helicopters and 700 visitors.

Overnight our airport based exhibition management company, Transcity, transformed the hangar to accommodate the Bank on Business Expo, with 73 local companies and over 500 guests in attendance. This is the second year of the Expo and it has grown considerably on year 1, offering local business a great sales and networking opportunity.

Looking forward to October we will host the Aim High Scholarship, an opportunity for ten 15 to 18 year old local young adults to explore and learn about the many opportunities in the

world of aviation. Their week includes visits to Gatwick, London City and a flying experience with EFG. Aim High is one of a number of airport initiatives aimed at inspiring our youth to join us in the aerospace world. Our commitment to establish the London Aerospace and Technology College here at Biggin was announced by Will Curtiss at our RAeS event.

And finally.....Will Curtis and myself were invited to the Charles Darwin annual prize giving, it was truly inspirational seeing local young people attaining such a high standard in their exam results and with so many now going on to further studies at universities and colleges.
